



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS LEVEL 2

What age does the Grapevine Studies Level 2 curriculum cover?

We have designed the Level 2 books for ages 8 to 10.

For what grade level was the Level 2 books designed?

3rd and 4th grade.

Can I teach children younger than 8 years old?

Yes, if they have a desire to learn. If they can draw within the space provided. We highly recommend trying a sample lesson on your student to determine their ability to use this book.

What supplies do I need to teach the Level 2 books?

Student Supply List: Bible, Grapevine Studies student book, and colored pencils.

Teacher Supply List: Bible, Grapevine Studies Teacher book, dry erase board & markers (8 colors), and Bible dictionary.

Will I miss anything if I start with an older level?

No, with each level we cover the same basic information; adding more Scripture reading, memorization, and study skills to each level. For example we add basic Bible geography in Level 3 and the use of study books in Levels 4 and 5.

Can I teach multiple ages with this curriculum?

Yes, our Levels 1 to 4 are compatible.

What teacher manual do I need?

For Level 2 we recommend the Level 1-2 teacher book. However, if you are teaching this book with students in either Level 3 or Level 4 books you can use the Level 3-4 Teacher book.

What is the difference between Level 1 and Level 2?

Level 2 students read more Scripture and memorize additional Bible facts. In addition to memory verses Level 2 students also learn:

Old Testament facts: Books of the Old Testament - Ten Commandments - Twelve Sons of Jacob

New Testament facts: Books of the New Testament -The Twelve Apostles - The Apostles Creed

What is the difference between Level 2 and Level 3?

Level 3 students learn basic biblical geography and read more Scripture than the previous levels. The stick figures for Level 3 are more detailed, adding names of people and cities.



May I make copies of Grapevine Studies book?

Yes, by purchasing the eBooks copies for your family, your class, or your group. By purchasing these eBooks your family, class or group then has the legal right to make copies.

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My student does not read, will this prevent them from using this curriculum?

No, teachers can read the written information to the student without hindering learning. The reviews for each lesson were designed to be done verbally.

What is the difference between the color and black/white teacher editions?

The content is exactly the same. The color teacher's manual contains the stick figures and lesson notes in color instead of black and white. Teachers who are visual learners may prefer the color version.
