



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS LEVEL 3

### **What age does the Grapevine Studies Level 3 curriculum cover?**

We have designed the Level 3 books for ages 10 to 13.

### **For what grade level was the Level 3 books designed?**

5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

### **Can I teach children younger than 10 years old?**

Yes, if they have a desire to learn. We highly recommend trying a sample lesson on your student to determine their ability to use this book.

### **What supplies do I need to teach the Level 3 books?**

Student Supply List: Bible, Grapevine Studies student book, and colored pencils.

Teacher Supply List: Bible, Grapevine Studies Teacher book, dry erase board & markers (8 colors), and Bible dictionary.

### **Since this level covers basic Bible geography, do I need a Bible Atlas to teach the Level 3 books?**

No, all the maps you will need are contained within the student and teacher books. However if you would like to have an additional Bible atlas we recommend the Atlas of the Holy Lands, available through Grapevine Studies.

### **Will I miss anything if I start with an older level?**

No, with each level we cover the same basic information; adding more Scripture reading, memorization, and study skills to each level. For example we add basic Bible geography in Level 3 and the use of study books in Levels 4 and 5.

### **Can I teach multiple ages with this curriculum?**

Yes, our Levels 1 to 4 are compatible.

### **What teacher manual do I need?**

For Level 3 we recommend the Level 3-4 teacher book. The Level 3-4 teacher book is also compatible with Levels 1 and 2, so if you are teaching multiple ages you will only need one teacher book.

### **What is the difference between Level 2 and Level 3?**

Level 3 students learn basic biblical geography and read more Scripture than the previous levels. The stick figures for Level 3 are more detailed, adding names of people and cities.

### **What is the difference between Level 3 and Level 4?**

Level 4 students learn where the books of the Bible fit into the Bible timeline. Students also learn how to use Bible study tools including a Bible concordance, Bible dictionary, and topical Bible.



**May I make copies of Grapevine Studies book?**

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**My student does not read, will this prevent them from using this curriculum?**

No, teachers can read the written information to the student without hindering learning. The reviews for each lesson were designed to be done verbally.

**What is the difference between the color and black/white teacher editions?**

The content is exactly the same. The color teacher's manual contains the stick figures and lesson notes in color instead of black and white. Teachers who are visual learners may prefer the color version.
